The 12th IFAA World Indoor Archery Championships will commence in 4 weeks time at the beautiful Resort Fundata in Brasov, Romania.

A record breaking 386 archers registered for the WIAC 2017 which will make this the largest WIAC ever.

27 Member countries will be competing in 57 different shooting styles and all expectations are that quite a number of World Indoor records will be broken. We all are looking forward to some exceptional precision shooting when the best competes against the best in the world.

26 European member countries will be competing in this highly anticipated event. The EFAC 2017 takes place from 28 July to 07 August 2017 in Hohegeiß in the Harz mountains of Germany.

The WIAMM is growing in numbers and this year is no different. More than 460 archers from 15 member countries



entered, representing 46 archery clubs world wide. New to the tournament are Germany, Wales, Scotland, Austria and South Africa. Brazil is taking top honours with 83 participants followed by Australia and Northern Ireland. Our most valued growth for this year is the participation of 40 cubs, 16 more than in 2016.

Congratulations to all who participated in the first round. Round 2 scores to be submitted by 10 March 2017.

The African Regional Field Archery Championships 2017 takes place at the end of April (29) at Heja Lodge near Windhoek in Namibia.
