

EFAA Shooting guidance for the Spring Champs 2021

Following the Prime Ministers announcement on 14th June and the decision not to remove all of the Covid restrictions we have put additional measures in place to ensure, as far as is practically possible, the archers safety.

- On arrival at Merlin you will be asked to wear a mask/face covering in the communal/muster areas owing to limited space
- You should, where possible, not congregate at the practice butts where the space is very limited, but come back to the larger area where there is more space
- Please register as normal, you will be given a target number and position 123 or 4 along with your score cards and pin badge, you will be given these for both days. This means that you will not all be able to shoot head to head on Sunday, apologies for this, but this will reduce the amount of close contact that you have over the weekend and means less people may have to isolate if the worse happens
- Directly after registration you will be required to attend bow inspection, so please have your equipment ready set up
- Please keep your face covering on until you reach your target
- Once you have completed the course, please return the score cards as soon as possible and leave the course as soon as you are able, again wearing a mask in the muster area
- On Sunday morning again you will be asked to wear a face covering/mask on leaving your vehicle and at the muster point, scores will be posted around the area and I am hoping to post them on Merlin's website
- Again, masks may be removed once on the peg
- Once you have completed the course please return the cards as soon as possible to enable the scores to be finalised and to allow the prize giving to occur in a timely manner
- Once prize giving is complete you will be encouraged to head home.
- Merlin will have hot food and drink available on both days which will be provided in a Covid safe way

PLEASE remember do not come to the shoot if you feel unwell, have a fever, a persistent cough or change to your sense of taste or smell or indeed if you have been asked to isolate.
